- If you are worried about anything

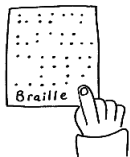
Telephone your GP and make an appointment.

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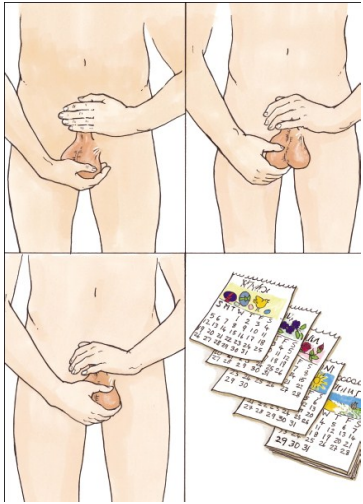

This leaflet tells you how to check your balls.

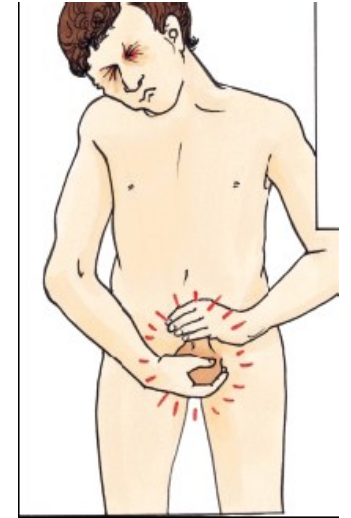
Check your balls after you have had a shower or a bath.



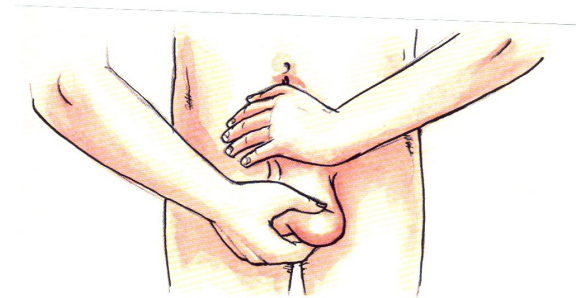
Look at the pictures.
